

First Aid Kit for Hounds

Antibiotic ointment: Bacracin, Betadine or similar and Arnica Gel
Antiseptic towelettes and non-latex gloves
Baby socks with skids: great for any paw or nail injuries (secured with vet wrap)
Benadryl liquid or dissolvable tabs: write dog's dosage on the packaging
Buffered Aspirin: can be used safely in small doses; check with your vet for proper dose for your hound(s).
Bulb syringe (nasal aspirator): for washing out sand from eyes
Can of plain pumpkin
Cauterizing wand (surgical type), styptic powder or blood clotting powder
Chicken stock: low sodium and fat with no MSG
Clean sheet material
Cotton swabs or Q-Tips
Curved scissors
Disposable diapers (unscented): very absorbent
Dramamine: for motion sickness
Ear cleaning solution
Elastic or ACE bandage: stretchy and can be used without tape
Emergency Blanket: for animals in shock or for carrying injured animals
EMT gel
Epsom Salt
First Aid tape
Gauze pads in multiple sizes: 3" x 3" smaller wounds; 5" x 5" for larger wounds
Gauze roll: 3" width
Hand sanitizer: for human use to clean your hands before applying first aid to the hound
Hydrogen Peroxide
Imodium
Instant Ice pack
Iodine solution 10%
Nail clippers
New Skin liquid bandage
Old hand towels
Old t-shirt
Oral dose syringe
Pepto Bismol or Maalox
Plastic bags
Regular adhesive strips
Roll of non-sterile cotton
Rubbing Alcohol
Safety pins in multiple sizes
Saline solution: use contact lens saline solution without preservatives
Sanitary napkins: unscented
Small blunt end scissors
Small jar petroleum jelly
Splint materials
Strait scissors
Syrup of Ipecac to induce vomiting: dosage rate of 0.5 – 1.0 milliliter per pound
Tagamet for upset stomach
Thermometer: for dogs only
Triangle bandage
Tweezers
Vet Wrap: 2" and 4" widths
